Dr. Zurawin served as Chief of Minimally Invasive Gynecologic at Baylor College of Medicine. He created the fellowship in Minimally Invasive Surgery and the fellowship in Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology at Baylor. Dr. Zurawin specializes in minimally invasive surgery with particular interest in uterine fibroids, endometriosis and alternative procedures to hysterectomy as well as urinary incontinence, pelvic organ prolapse and is a recognized expert in robotic surgery.

Dr. Zurawin is a member of many professional and scientific societies and has numerous committee appointments, both with national organizations and also at the hospitals at which he practices. Dr. Zurawin has served in many capacities including the Executive Board of Trustees of the Society of Laparoendoscopic Surgeons and is currently President Elect.
